<p>I. SAFETY IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF EVERY PERSON AT THE STATION</p> <p>II. GENERAL HOUSEKEEPING GUIDELINES</p> <p>A. Proper Storage</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Heavy objects on lower shelves2. Overhead storage only with proper guards <p>B. Tripping Hazards</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Identify2. Mark3. Correct <p>III. FLOOR SURFACES</p> <p>A. Wet Floors</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Mop dry2. Post signs <p>B. Showers</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Apply non-slip surface <p>C. Uneven surfaces</p>	<p>Have students give examples.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">-Electrical cords-Mop handles laid down-Open cupboard doors-Steps <p>Emphasize fact that many injuries are from falls on slippery floors.</p>

<p>2. Damp environment provides a good breeding area for germs</p> <p>VI. PERSONAL BEHAVIOR</p> <p>A. No Horseplay</p> <p>B. Develop Good Working Habits</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Put items away 2. Repair broken items <p>C. All Personnel are to be Encouraged to Seek Out, Identify, and Take Corrective Action When a Safety Hazard is Spotted.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Corrective action depending on situation varies from repairing or replacing the unsafe condition to reporting that condition to an immediate supervisor. <p>VII. STATION EMERGENCY PLAN</p> <p>Should Include the Following as a Minimum:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> A. "Emergency Building Evacuation Diagram B. "Emergency Plan Roster" (CSP Form 57.1) C. "Notice to State Employees" (Std. Form 621) 	<p>Include personal experience of horseplay and resulting injury. Have student give example of trying to do a simple job but spending a long time to find the tool that someone didn't put away.</p>
