V. RESPONSIBILITY OF EMPLOYEE

- A. Understand and Comply with Safety Rules and Regulations
 - 1. Participate with supervisor in developing safety plans
 - 2. Use all safety devices and safety equipment
 - 3. Practice safe working habits
 - 4. Keep informed of hazards in the working environment
 - 5. Consider safety in planning and carrying out work assignments
- B. Watch for Safety Hazards
 - 1. Correct if possible
 - 2. Inform co-workers and supervisor
- C. Report All Hazards to Your Supervisor
- D. Continually Evaluate Personal Work Habits
- E. Maintain a Positive and Aggressive Attitude toward Safety
- F. Report All Accidents and Injuries to Supervisor
